City Codes & Foxridge Covenants

In case you missed it.....

The August 4th edition of the Centennial paper had an article noting that the City will be targeting ailing trees & clutter. Much of this (stockpiling, inoperable vehicles, garbage) runs parallel to the FoxRidge Covenants. Quoting a council member, "Our neighborhoods are spotlighted as a great place to live, so we want to keep that going by having strong ordinances to protect our property values." This, too, is the basic mission of your FIA.

Simple consideration of the covenants goes far in preserving the beauty of FoxRidge. Stockpiling of junk, debris, & inoperable vehicles MUST be screened from view or enclosed in a structure. This too applies to boats, trailers, & recreational vehicles that can be seen most summer days throughout our community.

Garbage cans shall be walled off to conceal them from public view. The new city code states that garbage and garbage cans must be stored in areas that aren't visible from the street. Lids need to be used to minimize odor and preventing the spread of trash on windy days. This is stated in the covenants but is now more boldly defined by the city.

Ailing or dead trees, if in the eye of the city are deemed a danger or nuisance, could require residents to remove trees. If it is close enough to damage people or property were the tree to fall, it could be considered a nuisance. Aesthetic concerns alone won't constitute a nuisance.







September Update: Your GID Funds at Work

Landscape Maintenance: Three hours a week, as contracted with Erik Sutton, is not enough to keep up with weed eradication, trash pickup, tree/shrub trimming, sprinklers, and landscape maintenance throughout the neighborhood. Erik spent extra hours in early August to get caught up. Besides regular work, this included tree and shrub trimming.

Sprinklers: No repairs were necessary in the last month.

Tree Trimming: Trees across Mineral from the Swim and Racquet Club received an initial pruning to make parking along the street easier. A code compliance complaint was made to the City on July 13th and more extensive pruning will need to be done. Estimates are being gathered and work will commence in November or December after leaves have fallen.

Entry Areas: Many thanks to Beverly Hamilton for helping me work in the entry gardens along Quebec. She has 'adopted' the two at Mineral and Quebec and will keep a close eye on them and maintain as needed.

The west garden at County Line and Niagara looks pretty good, but the east garden is a little bare – something to work on in the future. The wildly growing east garden at Racquet Club has been maintained. More extensive work may need to take place later.

Electrical at Hillside: Electrical problems at Hillside prevented the monument lighting from functioning. Initial repair efforts were unsuccessful, so an electrician was hired. Repairs were scheduled for the week of August 13th.

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

1 large onion, chopped and sauteed
1 can Cream of Celery soup
1 med. jar dice pimento
2 cups French style green beans, drained
1 cup mayonnaise
1 pkg Uncle Ben's Long Grain & Wild
Rice, prepared
Salt & pepper to taste

Combine all ingredients. Pour into 2-1/2 or 3 quart casserole and bake at 350 for 25 – 30 minutes, or until heated through. Can be frozen. I sometimes add fried onions as a topping, adding them the last 10 minutes of baking.


