## President's Letter

### Editorialists, start typing!

The FIA Board has already seen much activity and comments concerning the upcoming Fence Committee survey. We are on schedule for holding Community meetings and block meetings so you, our residents, will be properly informed in order to give us your educated vote on what direction the GID should take pursuant to the Fence Project. We strongly encourage you all to participate in these meetings, and we also welcome your feedback. As I committed in last month's President's letter in *Foxtales* the FIA Board has worked to formulate guidelines for residents' editorials regarding equal space for opposing positions, article length, title, and how we respond to each submission in *Foxtales* while addressing inaccuracies and misconceptions. I also committed that we would not publish any editorials about the Fence Project until we had established these guidelines and published them in *Foxtales* for all to have equal opportunity to express their opinion in a forum that is fair for all.

At the April 13 Board meeting, we discussed the specifics of the guidelines, and we have subsequently voted on and approved them as written below. Here they are:

### Foxtales editorial purpose and guidelines

"The purpose of *Foxtales* is to provide a means for the Board of Directors of the Foxridge Improvement Association to communicate important information, events, and news to Foxridge residents. Goals of the FIA include keeping the neighborhood attractive, building a sense of community, and promoting friendly relations. The FIA board welcomes constructive feedback.

The following guidelines have been adopted by the board and will govern future *Foxtales* opinion letter submissions.

- Send your submissions to: [foxridge.board@gmail.com](mailto:foxridge.board@gmail.com)
  - Include: your full name, home address, and phone number with your submission. Address and phone number will not be printed in *Foxtales*.
  - Deadline: the 15th of each month so that letters can be reviewed before the press deadline of the 18th.
- Keep letters to 150 words or less.
  - Timely topics of general interest are given first preference.
  - Show respect for opposing opinions; stick to the issue and avoid personal attacks.
  - Your letter might not be printed if it addresses the same perspective on an issue as other letters submitted; however, note will be made stating the number of letters received that echo the same sentiment."

As President of the FIA, I take my responsibility to facilitate the exchange of opinions fairly and equitably very seriously. I believe that these guidelines will best allow for that exchange, and I am thrilled that we have established a level playing field for all who wish to share their opinions in the monthly *Foxtales*. I look forward to receiving your input and passing that input along to your neighbors via *Foxtales*.

If you want to share your opinion, please review the approved guidelines and send us your submission. Fence Project editorials from residents will begin to be published in the June *Foxtales*. I look forward to the exchange of ideas to further the value of our neighborhood and to promote a more cohesive and friendly neighborhood!

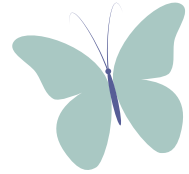
**Fence repair/staining** – Work is due to begin on May 2nd to power wash and stain several stretches of fence before the end of May.

## Membership Committee Report

The Membership Committee has been busy working on 3 separate campaigns to increase awareness of the FIA and its benefits and to encourage residents to join. Currently we have 225 paid FIA members.

Our first effort was to set up a table at our local King Soopers at County Line & Holly to greet neighbors going into the store and invite them to join our organization. They were also given the opportunity to register their email addresses to participate in the GID fence survey, as well as provide information for the Neighborhood Directory. We got 6 new paid members; 14 new email addresses; and several people took home forms and envelopes to mail in their dues. Thank you to Carl & Earlene Ramay, Susan, Matt and Paige Canetto, Martha Riley, Ed Bain, MaryAnne Moseneder, Tricia Anthonie and Derrol Moorhead for volunteering to help with this effort.

The second campaign will be sending out "Reminder" post cards to all those who have not yet paid their dues. Post cards are less expensive than a first class letter and we hope our message will be more readily visible. 1250 post cards have been printed for two separate mailings. The first mailing will be done the end of April. The second mailing will

be in July.

Our third endeavor will take place after Dumpster Day and after we've had a response from the Reminder post cards. This will be a door-to-door campaign, utilizing the unpaid residents list - with volunteers calling on their neighbors and encouraging them to join. So far we have 16 volunteers signed up for this effort and we welcome anyone who wants to participate. We may not get to everyone, but we will call on as many neighbors as we can.

There was only one house that closed last month and we will deliver cookies and a welcome packet next month when we, hopefully, will have a few more to include.

Julie Holt and David Hill are still working to get this up and running. Several issues need to be addressed and this has slowed our progress. Our volunteers keep plugging away, though, and we are hopeful that the new and improved web site will be functioning soon.

# Fence Project Update

The Foxridge GID Fence Committee continues to gather information and ideas to develop solution options to our fence problem. At present, the four options are shaping up to look like this:

1. Continue piecemeal repair with no improvements, keeping the current appearance, materials, height, and costs.
2. Keep the current look, replace the GID fence in phases with new cedar and improved structural components such as steel posts;
3. Adopt different design features, replace the GID fence in phases with new cedar and improved structural components such as steel posts;
4. Adopt different design features, replace the GID fence in phases with a composite material such as Trex or Endwood.

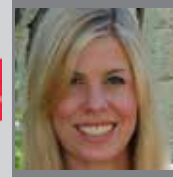
These options will be presented to Foxridge homeowners at a Community Meeting on Monday, May 16th from 7 to 8:30 pm at Willow Creek 3 Clubhouse, 8091 E. Phillips Circle, Centennial, just east of the park/playground. Each option presented will include a description of the option, cost information, visuals and photos, as well as a list of pros and cons.

The purpose of this meeting is to gather feedback on these ideas, plan block meetings that will help us continue to inform our neighbors and get their feedback, and discuss the survey that will be released during the summer. Survey results will be used to determine our next steps.

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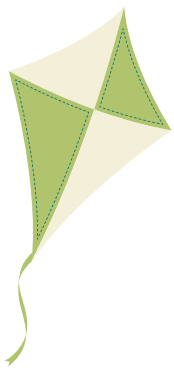

### Seeds to Sew International

Seeds to Sew International is an organization that works with two subsistence farming villages in Kenya to improve the lives of impoverished girls and women through education and job skills training. The nonprofit was founded by Ellyn Ito, her aunt, Lianne Aoyagi, and her mother Janice Ito, a long-time Foxridge resident and Cherry Creek School District educator. Their inspiration was to help disadvantaged women

and girls who are often denied education and are subjected to abuse from their husbands or guardians.

The organization provides their participants with any supplies they need, including donated fabric and sewing machines, so they can learn to sew and learn basic business skills. The women and girls make Enkiteng bags, Enkisoma bracelets, and Githomo gifts. The products are then sent to the U.S., where they are sold. All net proceeds are returned to the women participating in the program; school fees and school-related expenses are paid directly.

Seeds to Sew has strong ties to both the international community and the local community of Foxridge. In fact, Enkiteng bags, one of the products that returns the most money to Seeds to Sew participants, originated right here in Foxridge when Ellyn's husband started wrapping Christmas presents for the family in pillow cases! These bags are an eco-friendly, stylish, and convenient way to wrap your gifts. Ellyn, a 1987 graduate of Heritage High School, returns to Foxridge two or three times a year to hold events for Seeds to Sew in schools and churches, and often attends holiday gift fairs in the area. 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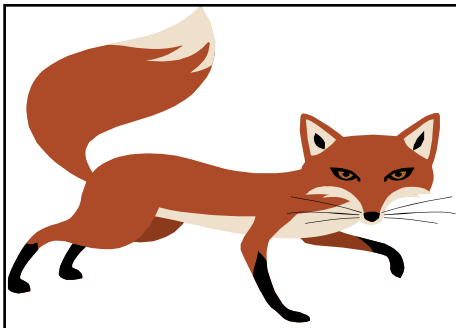

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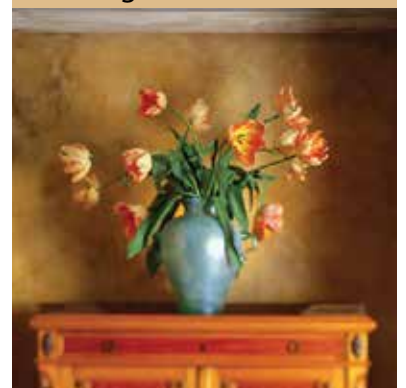
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## Meeting Observation Notes by John Zimmer | FIA Board of Directors Meeting | April 13, 2016

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Foxridge Improvement Association (FIA) was called to order April 13, 2016 by President, Dan Anthone, who determined that a quorum, 6 of 9, was present. After the meeting was called to order, Ed Bain showed up, at which point J. Zimmer asked if he should be considered part of the quorum or simply a “stinking late person who only cares about his nincompoop-self.” Aghast at the insult, E. Bain recited a haiku:

*Foxridge is awesome*

*Great families, friends, park, pool*

*Let’s tape John’s mouth shut*

Humbled by Bain’s incredible display of wit and artistic flourish, Zimmer publicly apologized, subjected himself to twelve lashes from each of the quorum (not including E. Bain who technically was not part of the original quorum), and the meeting continued uninterrupted.

**Introduction of Board Members:** Those present were Dan Anthone (President), Derrol Moorhead (Treasurer), John Zimmer (Secretary), John Konen (member at large), Judy Stauch (member at large), Martha Riley (member at large), and Ed Bain (member at large). Harley Rubottom (member at large) and Sue Townsend (Vice-President), were not present.

**Introduction of non-Board Members:** There were more than 200 neighbors present at the meeting, which was an incredible show of force from the community in support of Foxridge. President Anthone gushed forth his gratitude until half the crowd began chanting “Trump, Trump, Trump” which was soon matched by shouts of “Feel the Bern!” from the other half. Once it was discovered that neither Bernie Sanders nor Donald Trump would be speaking, most of the crowd dissipated, leaving about a half-dozen die-hard non-Board community members present. 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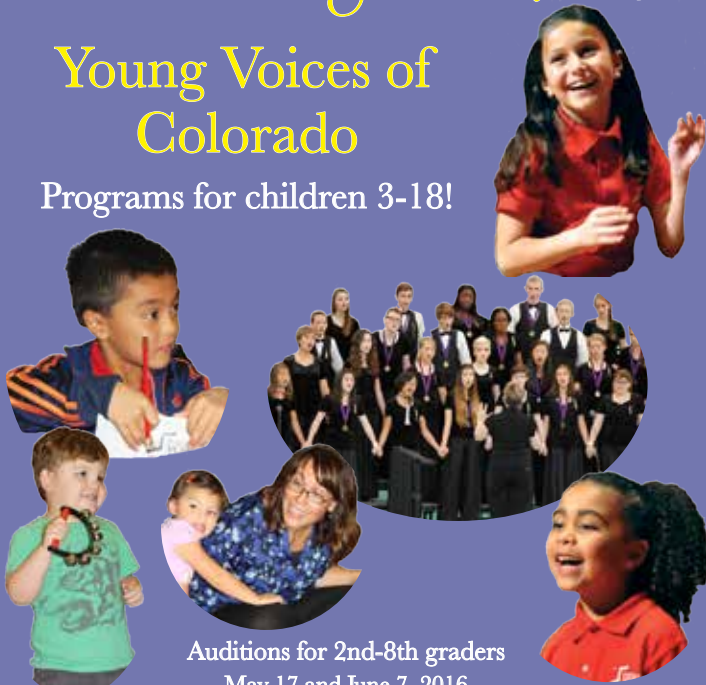
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# Home Wise May 2016
